

SECURITY TIPS

- 1) Be aware of suspicious patrons who may be casing your location for a future burglary and report your observations to local law enforcement and the ATF.
- 2) Have adequate security cameras installed and visible to store traffic.
- 3) Ensure your recordings are adequate and backed up in order to aid an investigation if your store is burglarized. Retaining at least 45 days of recorded video is recommended.
- 4) Test your burglar alarm system monthly with a simple process of walking through your facility and validating that all devices work properly. In addition, test your connection to your alarm monitoring station and that your cellular back-up communicator is working.
- 5) Install high-decibel interior and exterior audible alarms and interior strobe lights where permissible. (Strobe lights disorientate criminals.)
- 6) Leave lights on at night to deter criminals, who prefer to work under cover of darkness.
- 7) Be sure all exterior lights are working and provide adequate lighting for passing law enforcement and motorists during non-business hours.
- 8) Where possible, remove handguns from easily accessed glass display cases and secure in safes or gun rooms after hours.
- 9) Cable-lock highly desirable MSR-type firearms after closing.
- 10) Replace plain glass showcases with shatterproof glass or protective display cases.
- 11) Install 3M Lexan or other glass security film to prevent easy access to your premises through glass windows and doors.
- 12) Install door latch guards and add additional reinforcement to all premises doors lot s and frames.
- 13) Check roof hatches and air ducts for proper security.
- 14) Install iron framing, bars, security grills or drop-domeses on points of entry, including that to your warehouse.
- 15) Install "crash-proof" bollards or concrete barriers across your stree front prevent drive-through burglary scenarios. You can consider the same type of installations at the rear and sides of buildings where appropriate and a two le.



Knowing Your Marketplace:

How many potential recreational shooters live in your trade area?

Having a better understanding of your marketplace begins with an <u>estimation of the number of potential</u> recreational shooters in your trade area.

The best method to accurately assess participation is to conduct a <u>local market survey</u> whereby a representative sample of the population is asked a series of questions pertaining to shooting sports participation. Since this method is *very costly* (hiring a research firm to conduct a telephone survey or a direct mail survey), an alternative method is to <u>estimate participation based on state level data</u>.

Each year the National Sporting Goods Association (NSGA) releases a report titled, "Sports Participation – Shooting Sports". The report provides an estimated number of active participants for several shooting sports disciplines. The data is provided demographically and geographically. Caution: the NSGA numbers are based on random household surveys and as such are subject to confidence and reliability errors typical with any survey. They provide a good estimate but the actual number of shooters in your marketplace will depend on many other variables.

For the purposes of this report, a series of statistical factors are derived using the NSGA state-level data and the known population of your specific trade area to estimate participation. Your trade area's population is based on U.S. Census projections. The statistical factors are calculated using the following formula:
